

3rd Sunday of Lent

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. *Of course* we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

Ven. Eusebio Francisco Kino

Short Bio

Venerable Eusebio Francisco Kino was a prolific Jesuit missionary to the early Americas. He covered 50,000 miles on horseback establishing missions and ranches from northern Mexico through what is now California and Arizona, befriending Natives and settlers.

Lenten Obligations

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
- 3. The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.

Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.

4. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.

Fr. Michael S. Houston, C.Ss.R.



Fr. Mike Houston is a Redemptorist priest and is currently assigned as associate pastor of St. Mary's Parish in Annapolis, MD. He grew-up in a small town near Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Many of the seeds of his vocation were planted by the Church he attended during his youth, which was run by the Redemptorist Fathers. After completing high school and working various part and full-

time jobs, he worked for 8 years on the shipping docks of the Dart Container Corp. located in Leola, Pa. Fr. Mike believes his years on the shipping docks have served him well in ministry, giving him a strong work ethic as well as an understanding and appreciation for people in all walks of life.

After having a dramatic conversion experience in his early 20's, he began to feel the call to serve the Lord as a Redemptorist priest. After his ordination to the priesthood in May of 1998, he was immediately sent to the Caribbean, and there served for 6 years as a Redemptorist Missionary on the island of St. Croix in the U.S. Virgin Islands. He then served as pastor, house superior, and Episcopal Vicar of the Western Vicariate in the Roseau diocese on the island of Dominica in the West Indies for 5 years, and served a short time on St. Lucia before being transferred to St. Gerard parish in Lima, Ohio where he served for 8 yrs. before being transferred to St. Gerard's Parish in San Antonio, TX where he was stationed for 2 yrs. He was then sent to St. Mary's Parish in Annapolis, MD where he now serves. Fr. Mike has experience working on Redemptorist Missions in both the Caribbean and the U.S. He has been involved in both Hispanic ministry, the charismatic renewal and the healing ministry. He is also currently involved in youth ministry as the lead guitarist for the Parish Worship Band. At St. Mary's Fr. Mike is very much devoted to the Healing Ministry, conducting Healing Masses in both English and Spanish monthly.
