



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

December 28, 2025

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Matthew 2:13-15, 19-23

When I was ten, my dad gathered our family around the table in small-town Vermont and told us we were moving to the big desert city of Phoenix, Arizona. We were leaving behind family, friends, and everything familiar. None of us knew what to expect.

But something beautiful happened. As we made the move together, our family grew closer. In retrospect, I'm amazed at my parents' courage to go on that adventure. Even as a kid I realized our family found, in that challenge, a deeper unity and mutual love.

In today's Gospel, Joseph is told: "Rise, take the child and his mother, and flee..." (Matthew 2:13, 20). First to Egypt, then later to Israel. The Holy Family is frequently challenged to move and change, to adapt to God's will for them, in order to find safety in the midst of threat. It's not just an idiosyncratic story about survival. It's a spiritual pattern for all of us. Every Christian family is called to be a kind of sanctuary, especially in a world full of noise, busyness, and fear.

May I make a practical application for us? The Lord's Day, Sunday, is perhaps the most practical way we imitate this dynamic we see in Joseph and his family. Sunday is not meant to be just like every other day, filled with errands and stress. It's meant to be a day set apart; a holy "escape" into rest, worship, joy, and peace. A day to rise, take your family, and flee, into God's presence. — Father John Muir



MEDYTACJA EWANGELICZNA – POGŁĘBIONE ZROZUMIENIE PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO

28 grudnia 2025

Święto Świętej Rodziny: Jezusa, Maryi i Józefa

Mt 2, 13-15, 19-23

Kiedy miałem dziesięć lat, mój tata zebrał naszą rodzinę przy stole w naszym rodzinnym domu w Vermont i oznajmił, że przeprowadzamy się do wielkiego, pustynnego miasta Phoenix w Arizonie. Musieliśmy zostawić przyjaciół, znajomych i wszystko, co było nam do tej pory znane. Nikt z nas nie wiedział, czego się spodziewać. Ale dokonało się coś pięknego. Kiedy przenosiliśmy się razem, nasza rodzina stała się jeszcze bardziej zjednoczona. Patrząc dzisiaj z perspektywy czasu, wciąż jestem pod wrażeniem odwagi moich rodziców, którzy podjęli tak radykalną decyzje. Nawet jako dziecko dostrzegłem, że w tym trudnym czasie odnaleźliśmy głębszą jedność i wzajemną miłość.

W dzisiejszej Ewangelii Józef słyszy słowa: "Wstań, weż Dziecię i Jego Matkę i uchodź..." (Mt 2,13.20). Najpierw do Egiptu, a później z powrotem do Izraela. Widzimy jak Święta Rodzina nieustannie musi się przemieszczać, zmieniać, dostosowywać do Bożej woli, aby odnaleźć bezpieczeństwo w obliczu zagrożenia. To nie tylko wyjatkowa historia o przetrwaniu. To duchowy wzór również dla każdego z nas. Każda chrześcijańska rodzina jest powołana do tego, by być sanktuarium wiary i jedności — zwłaszcza w świecie pełnym hałasu, pośpiechu i lęku. Pozwólcie, że dodam jedną praktyczną wskazówkę. Niedziela, Dzień Pański, jest chyba najbardziej konkretnym sposobem naśladowania tego, co widzimy u Józefa i Świętej Rodziny. Niedziela nie ma być "kolejnym zwykłym dniem", przepełnionym zadaniami i stresem. Ma być dniem wyłączonym z codzienności; świętym, przeznaczonym na odpoczynek, modlitwe, radość bycia razem. To ma być dzień, w którym można "wstać, wziąć swoją rodzinę i uciec" – w obecność Boga. — Ojciec John Muir

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I use GPS wherever I go, and it serves me well most of the time. However, sometimes it leads me to a place that does not exist. Then there are those times when I am about to turn, and the man inside my phone shouts out, "GPS signal lost!" or "Rerouting!"

The problem is, when the area is unfamiliar to me, I have no choice but to listen. I could try to get where I am going by simple intuition or by pulling over to look at a paper map, but I don't trust my sense of direction. And I haven't bought a paper map in close

to a decade! Many people move through life without any direction. They find themselves constantly rerouting and wondering when they will ever get to a satisfying final destination. What they need is a compass and a companion for the journey. Yet they have no idea how to get either. Prayer can serve as a compass, and it connects us to a companion for the journey. Stewardship living is impossible without prayer. If we count on our own will and believe we can become fruitful without daily contact with the

Divine, we can find ourselves looking for directions more than moving toward a destination. God, through prayer, will help us see all we have as a gift. God, through prayer, will lead us away from materialism and selfishness and toward freedom and generosity.

Even when we fall to sin, the path back is clearer. God's GPS signal is never really lost. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS




(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - BENEATH THE SURFACE

I don't know exactly what kind of life Mary and Joseph envisioned when they were first betrothed — back in those simple times when they were just like any other couple who had hopes, dreams and no angels telling them what to do. Whatever their plans were, I think it's safe to say that the future God had in store for Mary and Joseph was not one either of them expected. I would imagine they both anticipated something a little quieter. A little more stable (no pun intended). A little less tumultuous. It exhausts me simply to read through the chaos of their movements in today's Gospel. Flee to Egypt, return to Israel (but not Judea! Herod's son is there! Divert to Galilee! Divert!). Settle in Nazareth (let me remind you, this is all happening with a baby in tow, and without the aid of a minivan). Take a deep breath, but don't get too comfortable — now it's almost time to lose your kid in Jerusalem. Then you'll have about 20 years off before he starts raising people from the dead, and that's when things start to get really crazy.

The story of the Holy Family is the ultimate example of the phrase "God had other plans." If any four-word sentence encapsulates what we can expect from the Christian life, it is this. I thought I was meant for that job, but God had other plans. I thought I would live in this place, but God had other plans. I thought I was supposed to become this person, but God had other plans. We can do all the right things. We can make all the right choices. We can say, over and over again until our voice wears out, "Thy will be done." But all we can know for sure is that God has other plans
