





GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

March 15, 2026 4th Sunday of Lent

John 9:1-41

If you are like me, it's easy to fixate on our shadows: failures, guilt, shame. Especially when we suffer, it is easy to want to blame ourselves or others. In this week's Gospel, Jesus' disciples ask about the blind man, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents?" (John 9:2) They, like us, focus on blame. But Jesus sees the entire situation differently: "Neither he nor his parents sinned; it is so that the works of God might be made visible through him." He does not deny sin, but he sees deeper — through the light of mercy, not the lens of judgment. The scene hinges on Jesus' strange claim: "I am the light of the world" (John 9:5). He sees things differently than everyone. They see shadows and light. He is the light.

Thought experiment: imagine you are the sun looking at everything on the earth. What do you see? Everything. What do you not see? Shadows. Everything is illuminated. If you see it, it is illuminated. For the light, nothing is dark.

Because he is the light, Jesus sees us in the glow of his redemptive love. Even our sin becomes a place where his glory can shine. The man's healing is not just about sight — it is about seeing as Christ sees. Lent is not a season of staring into darkness. It is a time to step into the light — to let Christ's gaze reframe how we see ourselves and one another.

Lenten challenge: Spend 10 quiet minutes this week asking Jesus to show you how he sees you. Not through shame or fear, but through the light of his mercy.— Father John Muir




MEDYTACJA EWANGELICZNA – ZACHĘTA DO
GŁĘBSZEGO ROZUMIENIA PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO

15 marca 2026

IV Niedzielę Wielkiego Postu (J 9,1–41)

Bardzo łatwo jest nam w życiu skupiać się na naszych „cieniach”: na błędach, porażkach, poczuciu winy czy wstydzie. Kiedy spotyka nas cierpienie albo trudności, często pojawia się pytanie: kto jest winny? Może ja? Może ktoś inny? Dokładnie takie pytanie stawiają uczniowie Jezusa w dzisiejszej Ewangelii. Widząc człowieka niewidomego od urodzenia pytają: „Rabbi, kto zgrzeszył – on czy jego rodzice, że urodził się niewidomy?” Uczniowie szukają winnego. Chcą znaleźć przyczynę, kogoś obarczyć odpowiedzialnością. Ale Jezus patrzy na tę sytuację zupełnie inaczej. Mówi: „Ani on nie zgrzeszył, ani jego rodzice, lecz stało się tak, aby się na nim objawiły sprawy Boże”. Jezus nie patrzy przez pryzmat winy. On patrzy przez pryzmat Bożego miłosierdzia i Bożego działania. Dlaczego? Bo Jezus mówi o sobie coś niezwykłego: „Ja jestem światłością świata”. Światło widzi wszystko inaczej. Pomyślmy przez chwilę: gdybyśmy byli Słońcem i patrzyli na Ziemię z góry, to co byśmy widzieli? Widzielibyśmy wszystko oświetlone. Czego byśmy nie widzieli? Cieni. Bo tam, gdzie jest światło, tam ciemność znika. I właśnie tak patrzy na nas Jezus. On patrzy na nas w świetle swojej miłości. Nawet nasze słabości i grzechy mogą stać się miejscem, w którym objawi się Boże miłosierdzie. Dlatego uzdrowienie niewidomego z dzisiejszej Ewangelii nie dotyczy tylko odzyskania wzroku. Chodzi o coś więcej – o nauczenie się patrzenia tak, jak patrzy Chrystus. Wielki Post nie jest tylko czasem wpatrywania się w nasze ciemności. To jest czas wychodzenia ku światłu i pozwalania, aby Jezus pokazał nam, kim naprawdę jesteśmy w Jego oczach. Dlatego spróbujmy w tym tygodniu zrobić coś bardzo prostego. Znajdźmy kilka minut ciszy i powiedzmy w modlitwie: „Jezu, pokaż mi, jak Ty na mnie patrzysz.” Nie przez pryzmat wstydu czy lęku, ale przez pryzmat Twojego miłosierdzia. Bo kiedy pozwolimy Jezusowi oświetlić nasze życie, odkryjemy, że tam, gdzie my widzieliśmy tylko cień, On widzi możliwość łaski.

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

I don't know about you. But if I was a blind person sitting by the side of the road, minding my own business, and a stranger came along and rubbed spit-mud in my eye, I'm just salty enough that I would ignore his words out of spite. Even though he was, admittedly, super-nice about the whole thing.

Obviously I would wash the mud out, because ... spit. But I wouldn't go to the Pool of Siloam. I would go to a pool on the whole other side of town, just to be contrary. I would make frustrated, grossed-out noises while I splashed water on my eyes: "Ugh! I can't believe this! People are the worst!" I would feel satisfied that I wasn't tricked or conned or taken advantage of.

And I would stay blind the rest of my life.

When Jesus performs a miracle in the Gospel, we sometimes think of it like a fireworks show. Something people point at — "Ooh! Aah!" — and move on from. But a miracle of Jesus is not a party trick. It is a commissioning. And each of us, in our own way, has the choice of accepting it or not.

Nowhere in the Gospel story does it say that Jesus promised the man sight if he washed in the pool. I wonder what it was that made the blind man feel he could trust Jesus. Was it something in his voice? Was it something in his touch? Was it the humanity with which he spoke of the blind man to his disciples — a gentleness missing from most other interactions of his life?

We'll never know. But we do know this: the blind man's sight wasn't restored until he made a decision. A decision to be sent.

Lenten Obligations

- The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.**
- All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.**
- The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.**

Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit one-self to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.

- The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.**

Everyday Stewardship

Talking about discipleship and truly being a disciple are two very different things. It is easier to know what we should do than to carry out. Many saints from our tradition have had much to say about this struggle to do what they know they must do, and not do that which they know they shouldn't. It is part of being human. Without God, we have no chance to overcome this predicament.

Without God, our actions can ring hollow, or often we are too immobilized to act at all. Without God, we suffer with blindness to the truth of what is important and eternal. The story in John 9 of Jesus healing the blind man is about more than a physical healing and just one man. It is about how each of us can find healing of our blindness by turning to Jesus Christ. Are you someone that has been saying, "I don't understand all this talk of discipleship and stewardship; what's the big deal?" We all have a blindness that needs to be healed, and the body of Christ needs you so that God's presence in our world can be seen in a more profound manner. The reality is that God heals the blindness of those who seek him so that, in turn, they may be vehicles by which others may see as well.

This Lent, you are invited to bring your blindness to Jesus. All the written reflections in the world will not give you new eyes. Those eyes can only be found in Jesus.
