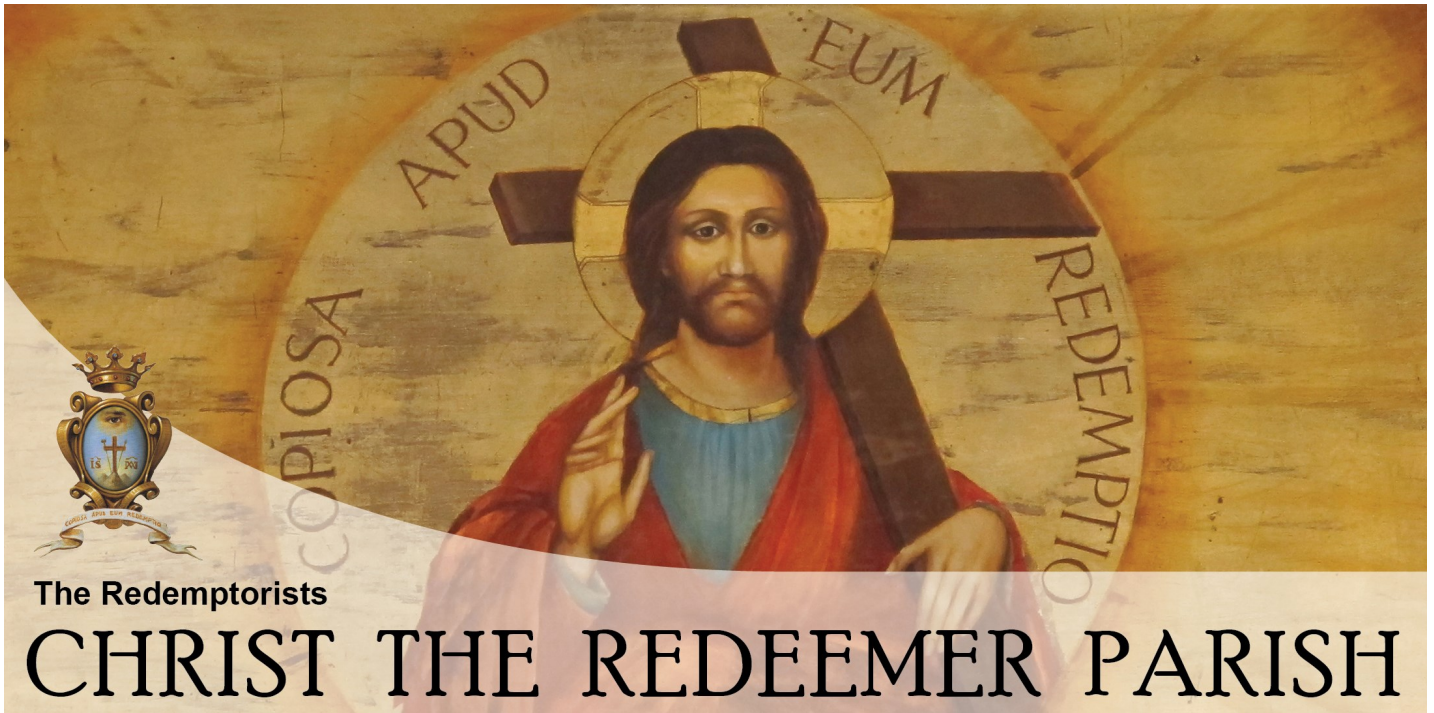

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

April 5, 2026 Easter Sunday

John 20:1-9

Zander Price was the fastest kid at my grade school. He won every race on Field Day. To me, his swiftness meant he was the greatest. Zander was the best.

It's the same with the speediest Apostle on Easter morning. John tells us he "ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first." (John 20:4) But only after Peter entered did John go in, see the burial cloths, and believe. Here is a symbol of two dimensions of the Church. John, the beloved disciple, represents the contemplative, mystical life: affection, prayer, intimacy. Peter, the rock, represents the Church's institutional life: steady, authoritative, structured...but slower.

Of course, John runs faster! Love is the heartbeat of Christian faith, so love will always arrive first. Peter's role is, in a sense, secondary. He arrives later, but is still very much needed. John waits for him. The Church must be built, balanced, protected, and led. Love without structure can vanish; structure without love becomes lifeless.

This dynamic is not just historical — it is personal. In you, there is a John who longs to run to the tomb in love. Let him run! Pray, sing, love Jesus. There is also a Peter, who eventually gets to the tomb and takes charge. The Risen Christ wants both. Remember: if you want to get to the mystery of Jesus' resurrection fast...love him, for love is best.

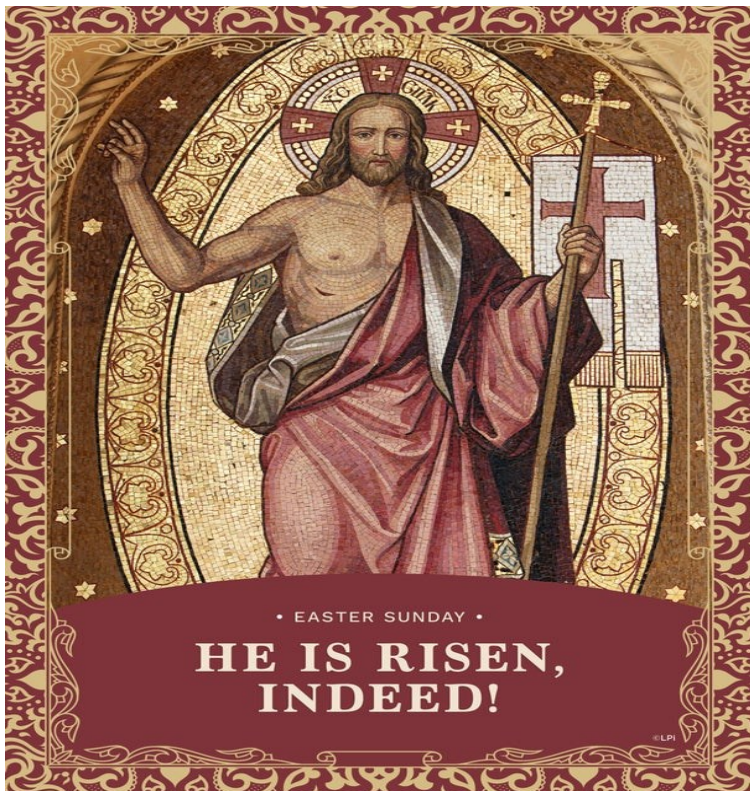

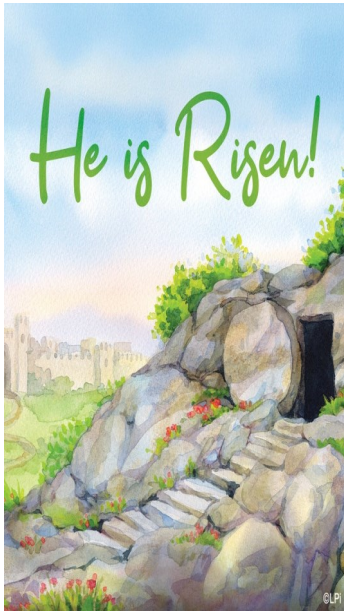
MEDYTACJA EWANGELICZNA – ZACHĘTA DO
GŁĘBSZEGO ROZUMIENIA PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO
5 kwietnia 2026
Niedziela Zmartwychwstania Pańskiego
J 20, 1–9

Zander Price był najszybszym chłopcem w mojej szkole podstawowej. Wygrywał każdy bieg podczas szkolnego dnia sportu. Był najlepszym ze wszystkich uczniów.

Podobnie jest z najszybszym apostołem w poranek wielkanocny. W Ewangelii czytamy, że „Jan wyprzedził Piotra i pierwszy przybył do grobu” (J 20,4). Jednak dopiero po tym, jak Piotr wszedł do środka, Jan wszedł również, zobaczył płótna i uwierzył. Jest to obraz dwóch wymiarów Kościoła. Jan, umiłowany uczeń, reprezentuje wymiar kontemplacyjny i mistyczny: miłość, modlitwę, bliskość. Piotr, skała, reprezentuje wymiar instytucjonalny Kościoła: stały, uporządkowany... ale wolniejszy.

Oczywiście, że Jan biegnie szybciej! Miłość jest sercem wiary chrześcijańskiej, dlatego zawsze dociera pierwsza. Rola Piotra jest w pewnym sensie drugorzędna. Przychodzi później, ale wciąż jest bardzo potrzebna. Jan na niego czeka. Kościół musi być uporządkowany, zachowywać równowagę, być chroniony i prowadzony. Miłość bez struktur może się rozproszyć; struktura bez miłości staje się martwa.

Ta dynamika nie jest tylko wspomnieniem historii— jest także osobistym doświadczeniem. W Tobie jest Jan, który pragnie pobiec do grobu z miłości, więc pozwól mu biec! Módl się, kochaj Jezusa. Jest w Tobie także Piotr, który w końcu dociera do grobu i podejmuje odpowiedzialność. Zmartwychwstały Chrystus chce obu. Pamiętaj: jeśli chcesz dotrzeć do tajemnicy zmartwychwstania Jezusa... kochaj Go, bo miłość jest najważniejsza.— O. John Muir

While It Is Still Dark

If you are a person who is religious in any way, chances are that at some point, someone has asked you to give a reason why. I meet lots of people who identify as spiritual but not religious, lots of people who are more comfortable splashing in the shallow end of belief but hesitating to wade into the more uncertain depths of doctrine. So when they ask the question "Why do you believe what you believe?" it usually comes out as "Why do you go to church?"

They want to know why I come to this specific place at this specific time. What am I expecting to happen? We read that Mary Magdalene went to the tomb "while it was still dark." I imagine she could not sleep. She was traumatized. Grieving. Confused. Angry, perhaps. Doubting? Maybe. It's possible. We cannot know what was in her heart. We only know what she did. We only know where she went. And we know that it was dark, that the light of Easter's dawn had not yet pierced the sky. Often, I am grieving when I go to church, or angry, or confused, or all three. I have gone many times with a doubting and resentful heart. Because, you see, it is still dark. The dawn of eternity, which will illuminate all understanding, has not yet even begun to creep across my horizon.

My answer to the question, when I am asked, is that I go to church — to Catholic Mass, specifically — for the same reason Mary Magdalene went to the tomb. I go because it is the last place I saw Christ, and I am desperate to see him again.

St. Francis Indulgence

On January 10, 2026, His Holiness Pope Leo XIV declared a special Jubilee Year of Saint Francis on the occasion of the 800th Anniversary of the death of Saint Francis of Assisi. This jubilee calls every faithful Christian, following the example of the Saint of Assisi, to "become a model of holiness of life and a constant witness of peace". The Apostolic Penitentiary, in accordance with the will of the Holy Father, granted a plenary indulgence on this occasion during the period of January 10, 2026 to January 10, 2027.

The indulgence can be obtained under the ordinary conditions and by making a pilgrimage to any Franciscan conventual church or a Place of Worship dedicated to St. Francis of Assisi (e.g., our Cathedral) or connected to him and then participate in a liturgical celebrations or spend at least a reasonable period of time in pious meditation and raise prayers to God.

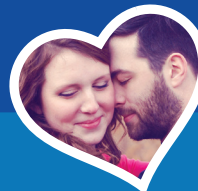
