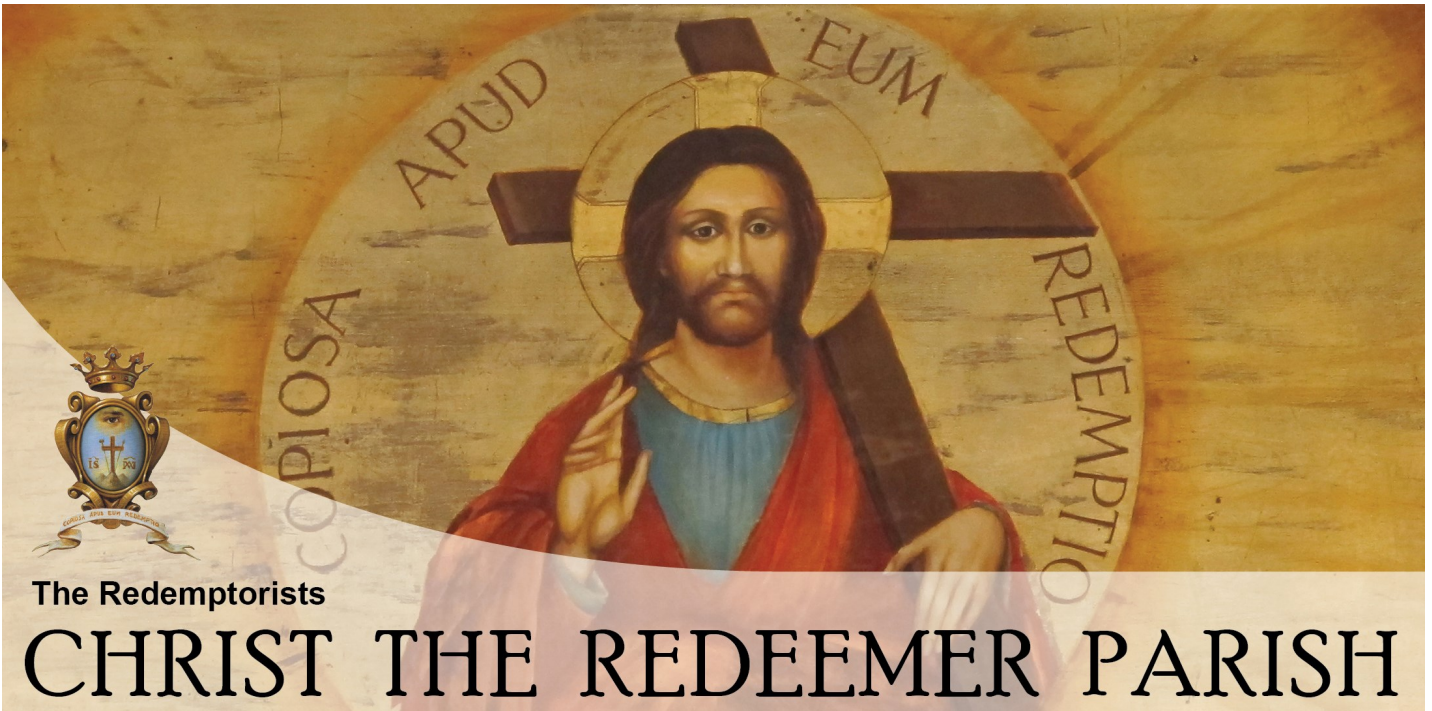

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

April 12, 2026

2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

John 20:19-31

“Then he said to Thomas, ‘Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe.’” (John 20:27)

In my early 20s, I volunteered at a parish youth group. I witnessed teens encountering Jesus with a fresh, romantic wonder that reminded me of my own teenage conversion. But something had changed in me. I was quietly jaded and cynical. When teens shared stories of encountering Christ, I'd want to sarcastically murmur, “Well, good for you.” I had grown suspicious of the zeal I once knew. Then we brought the group on a pilgrimage. I was standing in an old church in France, ignoring a long-winded tour guide. I found myself before a crucifix. In that moment, I heard something, not audibly, but unmistakably in my heart: “I came to be your friend... and you wish to be my enemy? Why do you stand far from me? I suffer gladly for you. I was pierced for you. Why do you run from me?” My heart opened. I saw how cold and cynical I had become. But Jesus had not given up on me. He had returned, and his mercy broke through. So I can relate to the scoffing — and transformation — of Thomas when the Risen Jesus presents his wounds for inspection. Thomas is not simply doubting; he is guarded, suspicious, even cynical. But Jesus comes to him. No lecture. Just understanding and mercy. He invites Thomas to touch his wounds. This burns away his cynicism like the morning mist. — Father John Muir

MEDYTACJA EWANGELICZNA – ZACHĘTA DO
GŁĘBSZEGO ZROZUMIENIA PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO

12 kwietnia 2026

2. Niedziela Wielkanocna (Niedziela Miłosierdzia Bożego) J
20, 19–31

„Potem rzekł do Tomasza: «Podnieś tutaj swój palec i zobacz moje ręce; wyciągnij rękę i włoż ją do mojego boku – i nie bądź niedowiarkiem, lecz wierzącym»” (J 20,27).

Kiedy miałem trochę ponad dwadzieścia lat, pomagałem w parafialnej grupie młodzieżowej. Widziałem, jak młodzi ludzie pełni zapału i zachwytu spotykają Jezusa. Przypominało mi to moje własne doświadczenie wiary z młodych lat. Z tym, że z czasem we mnie coś się zmieniło. Stałem się bardziej znużony, trochę zamknięty i cyniczny. Gdy inni opowiadali o swoim spotkaniu z Jezusem, w moim sercu pojawiała się myśl: „No dobrze, cieszę się z tobą ale ja już tego nie czuję”. Zaczęłem patrzeć z dystansem na ten zapał, który kiedyś sam miałem.

Pewnego dnia pojechaliśmy na pielgrzymkę do Francji. Stałem w starym kościele i szczerze mówiąc, nie miałem ochoty słuchać przewodnika. Nagle znalazłem się przed krzyżem Jezusa. I wtedy w sercu usłyszałem słowa: „Przyszedłem, żeby być twoim przyjacielem... a ty uciekasz ode Mnie? Dlaczego trzymasz się z daleka? Dla ciebie cierpiałem. Dla ciebie zostałem przebity. Dlaczego ode Mnie uciekasz?” To mnie poruszyło. Zobaczyłem, jak bardzo oddaliłem się od Jezusa, jak bardzo moje serce stało się chłodne. Ale Jezus mnie nie odrzucił. Przyszedł do mnie jeszcze raz. Jego miłosierdzie przebiło się przez mój opór.

Dlatego rozumiem św. Tomasza. On nie tylko wątpił. On był zamknięty, nieufny, może nawet trochę oczarowany. A jednak Jezus przyszedł właśnie do niego. Nie zrobił mu wyrzutów. Nie wygłosił kazania. Po prostu pokazał mu swoje rany i powiedział: „Dotknij”. I to wystarczyło. Serce Tomasza się zmieniło. Jego niedowierzenie zniknęło jak poranna mgła. Jezus robi to samo z nami. Przychodzi nawet wtedy, gdy wątpimy, gdy jesteśmy zmęczeni czy zniechęceni. Nie odrzuca nas. Przychodzi z miłosierdziem.. John Muir

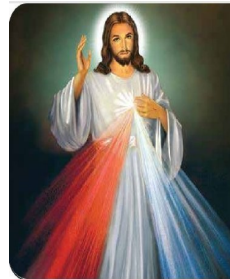

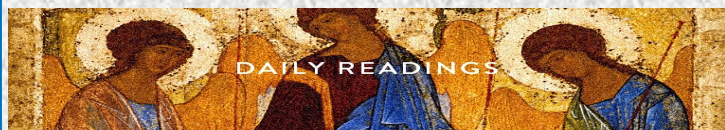

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The early days of the first Christian community were not easy by any measurement. Jesus had been executed, and his disciples had to be discreet so as not to meet a similar fate. Jesus was now risen, but the truth of his resurrection was not accepted by all. However, the depiction of that early community in Acts 2:42-47 would lead someone to believe it was the opposite situation. We are told of community life where people lean on each other and share great joy. They ate and prayed together, and many wonders and signs were occurring to lift the community and bear witness to the power of Jesus Christ. They were disciples living out their faith, and it was their strong sense of stewardship that made all this possible in the face of threatening Roman and Jewish powers.

Today, we find the Church in a new turmoil. Increasing secularism, abuse scandals, and a lack of true fidelity place us once again in a time that is not easy. A friend of mine likes to say that any challenge of sin we encounter in the Church has its origin in a lack or misunderstanding of the stewardship way of life. We create our burdens by not using our gifts wisely and by turning inward selfishly.

Could we use the story in Acts of the early Church to help us today? If we begin with the decision to give of ourselves completely to God and His people, will we become agents of change? There is only one way to find out.

Praying the Chaplet of Divine Mercy is a glorious way to enter into the abundant Mercy of God.

It only takes a few minutes and can easily be prayed almost anywhere. Using a rosary, follow this guide to offer this wonderful prayer. It is especially good to pray it at the three o'clock hour.



How to Pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet

1. Make the Sign of the Cross

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

2. Optional Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fount of mercy for us, I trust in You!

3. Our Father

Our Father, Who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, Amen.

4. Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace. The Lord is with thee. Blessed art thou amongst women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.

5. The Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; on the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there He will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

6. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the 10 Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades

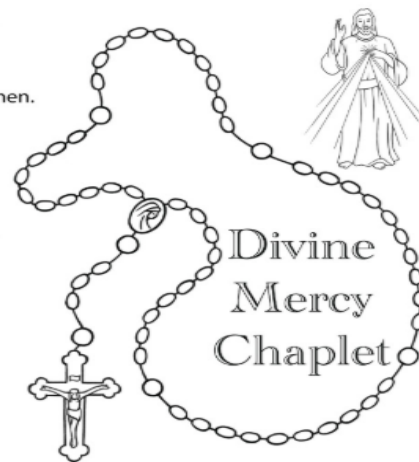
Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.

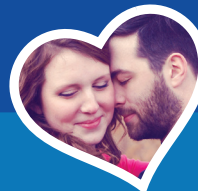
