14TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

In some parts of the world, irrigating fields to ensure a reasonable harvest has always been a difficult task. Water does not like to move uphill. It needs to be forced in that direction. By the second century BC, innovations in irrigation technology led to the widespread use of the Persian wheel, which employed animals-often oxen-to move water. Yoked to an arm that turned a wheel fitted to a cog that moved the lift buckets, the oxen could be made to walk around and around all day. If needed, anyone could be fitted to the yoke to ensure the flow of water for the survival of the crops.

The Gospel this weekend speaks of an easy yoke and a light burden. Jesus invites those who are burdened to come to him and to learn meekness and humbleness of heart. The followers of Jesus are lifelong learners as they uncover an ever deeper understanding of what it means to be a disciple. Jesus is the teacher who continuously reveals the Father to those who come to him. And the yoke that one accepts is not the burden of the law of the Pharisees, but the easy yoke of life in Christ.

This is the difference between those oxen who turn a Persian wheel and the disciple of Christ. The oxen go round and round all the day long. Their circular path is never ending and though they walk the whole day, they do not go anywhere. Their labor is productive, but not life-changing. The disciple who takes on the yoke of Christ accepts his invitation to walk with him. In doing so, we take on the burden of learning from Christ. Think back to the Eight Beatitudes we heard so many months ago. Those eight precepts are the law that Jesus expects his followers to live under, the yoke that we take on in our Christian lives. The beatitudes are the wellspring that nurtures our lives.

Greetings from the Office of the Diaconate

Over the next several months, the Office of the Diaconate will be publishing articles about the ministry of deacon. The articles will be presented in a question and answer format. Our goal is for you to become more familiar with the ministry of deacons, their role in our Church and the requirements for ordination.

Question #12:

If the wife of a deacon dies, may the deacon get married again?

Canon law normally prohibits any cleric from getting married. Notice that canon law does allow married men to be ordained to the permanent diaconate; but normally, once ordained, a man cannot marry. This means that if a deacon's wife dies, the normal course is for the deacon to remain celibate. Under certain conditions, a deacon's bishop may petition the Holy See for a dispensation from canon law so that the deacon might marry again, but this is an exceptional situation and not the norm.

New Jersey's Adoption Law has changed

What birth parents need to know...

New Jersey's adoption law has changed with regard to adoptees' access to full birth record information. In the future, the names of all birth parents who placed a child for adoption in New Jersey will be made available to adoptees upon request *unless* the birth parents file a form with the State indicating that they do not want contact with the child.

Birth parents who were assured anonymity previously are able to request continued privacy but to do so, they must complete and submit a form with the State no later than December 31, 2016.

As soon as more information is available and the State of New Jersey releases the necessary form(s) Catholic Dioceses statewide will post related information on their websites.

In the meantime, here is what all birth parents should know:

For adoptions finalized prior to August 1, 2015:

- Adoptees will be able to obtain an original birth certificate without involvement of the courts beginning **January 1, 2017**.
- Birth parents have until **December 31, 2016** to file a request with the State of New Jersey indicating that they want *no contact* with the child they gave to adoption. If a birth parent files such a request, the State Registrar will redact the birth parent's name from any documents provided to adoptees. If they fail to file such a form their identity will be revealed to the adoptee upon request.

All birth parents who request redaction will be required to update medical history information every 10 years until the birth parent reaches the age of 40 and every five years thereafter.

For adoptions finalized <u>after</u> August 1, 2015:

Long-form birth certificates will be available to adoptees *without redaction* of a birth parent's name. Birth parents, who give a child to adoption after August 1, 2015, will be able to file a form with the State indicating that they wish to have *no contact* with the adopted child or whether they are willing to have direct contact or contact through an intermediary. In all cases, in the future, birth parents will need to file with the State information about their medical history.

As noted above, information on how birth parents should request continued privacy is not yet available from the State. As soon as the State releases the information, all Catholic Dioceses in New Jersey will post that information on their websites.
