



Then he looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, "Ephphatha!"-that is, "Be opened!" And immediately the man's ears were opened, his speech impediment was removed, and he spoke plainly.

- Mk 7:34-35

"He took him off by himself away from the crowd. He put his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue." Jesus could have healed this deaf man another way. He could have spoken a powerful word or, for that matter, just silently willed that the man's health be restored. It wasn't uncommon for Jesus to cure people simply by a quick touch. But instead, Jesus chose to heal him in this unique way. He made it a private event, one that involved unusual kind physical Clearly, this was not for Jesus' sake. And since it was away from the crowd, it wasn't for their sake either. This particular healing was for this particular man. For whatever reason, Jesus knew that this man needed these signs-touching his ears and putting saliva on his tongue--in order to be freed of his inability to hear and speak well.

Jesus knows what we need. His care for each and every one of us is not some standardized package of generic charity. He loves us all as unique individuals and understands us. He sees our weaknesses and knows our strengths. He offers himself to us as an intimate friend, not an unfamiliar acquaintance. When we come to him with our hopes, our fears, our desires and needs, he hears and answers us ... in the way he knows is best. It might seem odd. It might be unexpected or different from what we have seen him do for others. But we need to trust, even when we are desperate for "healing," that Jesus does care, that he does listen, and that he does act on our behalf.

Let us have confidence in today's Old Testament proclamation from Isaiah: "Thus says the LORD: Say to those whose hearts are frightened: Be strong, fear not! Here is your God ... he comes to save you."



New Jersey Adoption Law Has Changed – What You Need to Know:

For well over a century, the Catholic Church in New Jersey has provided adoption services. Throughout all those years, the Church promised to honor the privacy of birth parents and adoptees. That promise of privacy also was assured by law and affirmed by the State Superior Court. Those promises can no longer be kept. On May 27, 2014, a new law took effect that will allow adoptees and certain relatives to request and obtain the names of their biological parents beginning January 1, 2017. Any birth parents who wish to preserve their privacy must submit a Redaction Request Form to the New Jersey Department of Health no later than December 31, 2016. By filing this form, birth parents will be able to keep their names off any documents provided by the State to adoptees or anyone else. The State made the **Redaction Request Form** public on August 3, 2015. The form can be downloaded at http://nj.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf. If you know a person who placed a child for adoption, please tell them that if they do not file a *Redaction Request Form*, their name and other information could be given to the adoptee. CENSUS -- WHY VERIFY/UPDATE PARISH RECORDS

On an almost daily basis the parish office receives requests for confirmation of being "a catholic in good standing" for the following requests: "I want to marry!" "I want to be a godmother/godfather!" "I want my child to be baptized, to receive Holy Eucharist, to receive Confirmation, etc." "Mom/dad/child/family member needs the Sacrament of the Sick/funeral/burial."

The time to update your records is NOW not when a sacramental need is necessary or even critical. With 45% outstanding responses telephone calls will continue in an attempt to include all parishioners in the parish census. Many calls thus far have resulted in "telephone number is no longer in service;" or no response to messages left. Those who cannot be contacted and there is NO parish evidence of attendance at mass, etc. will be notified via mail documenting the number of attempts made to contact them and ultimately will be eliminated from the active parishioner database.
