

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Barry had a life sentence in prison for doing unthinkable crimes. He would often remark to the chaplain that he was an atheist and could not bring himself to believe in any "god." When the chaplain asked why, Barry quickly retorted that the book of Genesis speaks of God creating everything and feeling very good about it. God's creation of people and things is beautiful. Barry continued, "If there is a God who creates something and likes what He makes and that God is good, then how could He have created someone as evil as me?" The chaplain fell silent as tears welled up in his eyes. "God loves you too, Barry. The stuff that you did is another matter. God puts His image and likeness in each one of us, in our souls. How can God not love himself?" God cannot despise or hate anything or anyone. He made you. Life hurt you. He is always about unconditional love and mercy. Barry found a glimmer of hope that day and was touched by love.

Zacchaeus met love incarnate in Jesus. He knew there was something special about him, and he had to see Jesus for himself. Realizing and knowing God's unconditional, penetrating love is a game-changer. Sinners don't repulse Jesus, he wants to eat with them! We can often find ourselves conflicted about how God sees us. We want to believe that He loves us, but other tapes playing in our heads convince us that this cannot be true. We carry our sins around like heavy sacks weighing on our shoulders. We are crippled.

God's divine blessing lives in each of our souls. It is our essential goodness, a free gift given to us by God. The beginnings of salvation's blessings are discovered when we begin to understand who God is, who we are, and how we are to act relative to our brothers and sisters. We become more focused and courageous, eager to gather up all of the fragments of our lives and become whole. Zacchaeus, after meeting Jesus, finally knew who he was. He saw his sins and his potential for goodness as a blest child of God. When we allow God to meet us and touch us in such a profound way, we find what our selfishness has lost. We are on the road to salvation.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? - CATHOLIC LIFE EX-PLAINED

Priesthood

Question:

If someone is interested in becoming a priest, how does he go about it?

Answer:

Discerning a vocation can happen in any number of ways. It might come as a surprise to the person called or to family or friends. Sometimes it is a gradual process, and other times it is as quick and bright as lightning. Regardless of how it starts, a vocation to the priesthood or religious life requires a process of discerning, testing, and preparing. The best place to begin would be with lots of prayer, receiving the sacraments, and attending daily Mass whenever possible. Then talk to your pastor or a priest you know and trust. Your diocese may have a vocation director who can provide you with guidance and information. The Serra Club is also a great resource for information and contacts to help you discern if indeed God is calling you.

Remember that many young Catholic men have considered the priesthood. Some are ordained and others realize this is not their calling. However, we are all called to be of service to others as we practice our faith. These are extraordinary times in which we live, and they require an extraordinary witness to faith and to God's presence in the world. Our work, our ministry as Catholics, is to be the body of Christ with and for others. The Church needs priests. If God calls you to ordained service in the church, He will provide the grace, direction, and support you need. Just listen and respond with all your heart, mind, and soul.

FUNERAL PLANNING/PROTOCOL

FUNERAL PLANNING DECLARATION

While no one likes to think of his or her death, I encourage you to reflect on the beauty and meaning of the Catholic funeral and let your loved ones know your desires. You cannot be sure what the situation will be in the future, nor where your family members will be in terms of their faith. Thus, it is critical to express your desires in a written document of Funeral Planning Declaration, which specifies your funeral wishes. Just as a will directs the allocation of your assets as you want, the Funeral Planning Declaration document specifies your desired funeral arrangements. The Funeral Planning Declaration is separate from a will, power of attorney or similar documents and can be revised or destroyed if you have a change of heart. Our parish office staff can assist in the preparation of this document and keep it in your parish file. Keep in mind a funeral should respect who a person is; a person's faith tradition is an essential component of who one is and the hope we have as Christians.

CATHOLIC FUNERAL MASS PROTOCOL

The first thing to be done if you know a death is imminent, immediately call the priest so he can hear your or your loved one's last confession, administer the anointing, and give Communion. Do not confuse this with the Anointing of the sick. Anointing of the sick is a special anointing given to the sick not in imminent danger of death. A funeral home should be contacted first following the death of a loved one. The funeral home serves as the competent intermediary to assist the bereaved with many of the required decisions.

During a Catholic funeral Mass, several elements of protocol should be followed:

• First and Second Mass Readings - Family members/friends are discouraged from doing any of these readings because it is such an emotionally-charged time for them.

• Words of Remembrance and Eulogies should be said at the vigil service or at the gathering following the graveside service.

• The **Music** at a funeral Mass should be liturgically appropriate. The organist/cantor will assist in selecting appropriate songs. Popular Christian music which is inappropriate at Mass can be used at the funeral home or other gathering.

Cremation – The funeral directors should outline the order of the church's preference as follows:

- a vigil, rosary, wake or prayer service may be held the day before the funeral Mass at the funeral home;
- the deceased is brought to church for the celebration of the Mass of Christian Burial prior to cremation;
- after Mass the deceased is transported to the cremation facility;
- burial of the cremains in a consecrated cemetery.
- If for some reason cremation occurs prior to the Mass, the cremains urn is brought to church for the celebration of the Mass followed by burial.

Please note: Cremains must be sealed, usually in an urn. They are treated with the same respect as a body in a casket and blessed by the priest. They must be buried or sealed in a mausoleum – NOT on your mantle or spread around.

Memorial Mass – If either the above options or the body is not available due to justifying circumstances, a memorial Mass can be held for the deceased.

Unbaptized/Stillborn Child – The Church's funeral rites may be celebrated for a child who died before baptism as well as stillborn/fetus whose parents intended to have the child baptized. The decision/procedure for the interment is decided by the parents and pastor.

Organ Transplants and Donations of Bodies for Medical Science – "Organ donation after death is a noble and meritorious act to be encouraged as an expression of generous solidarity" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, n.2296). Likewise, the donation of bodies is legitimate. However, in keeping with Christian respect for the body, there should be reasonable assurance that the remains will be disposed of in a reverent manner upon completion of the research.
