



The faith that comes from Christmas calms our fears and allows us to go into the nighttime of our lives courageously. We are never lost or alone. We need to stop and savor more of life's moments before they slip away in time. God is with us, loving us, and leading us where we need to be. God is born again and again in every soul willing to give birth to His presence. God connects us and provides us with a place where we feel safe and welcome: home. Merry Christmas!



Holy Name Society

We are celebrating today the birth of our Redeemer. On the 3rd day of January we will be celebrating the Feast of the Most Holy Name of Jesus. Jesus is the name given to Christ, our Redeemer, a name mandated by Heaven and adored by the Church since its very beginning. Apostle Paul wrote: "... God highly exalted Him and bestowed on him the name above every other name, so that at Jesus' name every knee must bend..." (Philipians 2:9) In the 13th century Pope Pius IV initiated the formation of the Holy Name Society to promote respect for the Holy Name and to serve the Church as needed.

In past one hundred years the Holy Name Society was vitally functioning in the two catholic parishes of Manville. But in recent years it fell on hard times and is in need of new life. To initiate renewal, the Holy Name Society of the Christ the Redeemer Parish in Manville will hold its first 2023 meeting on Monday, January 2nd in the John Neumann building. Every adult member of our parish is invited, ladies as well as men. Find out what the HNS is and what it could be. 
