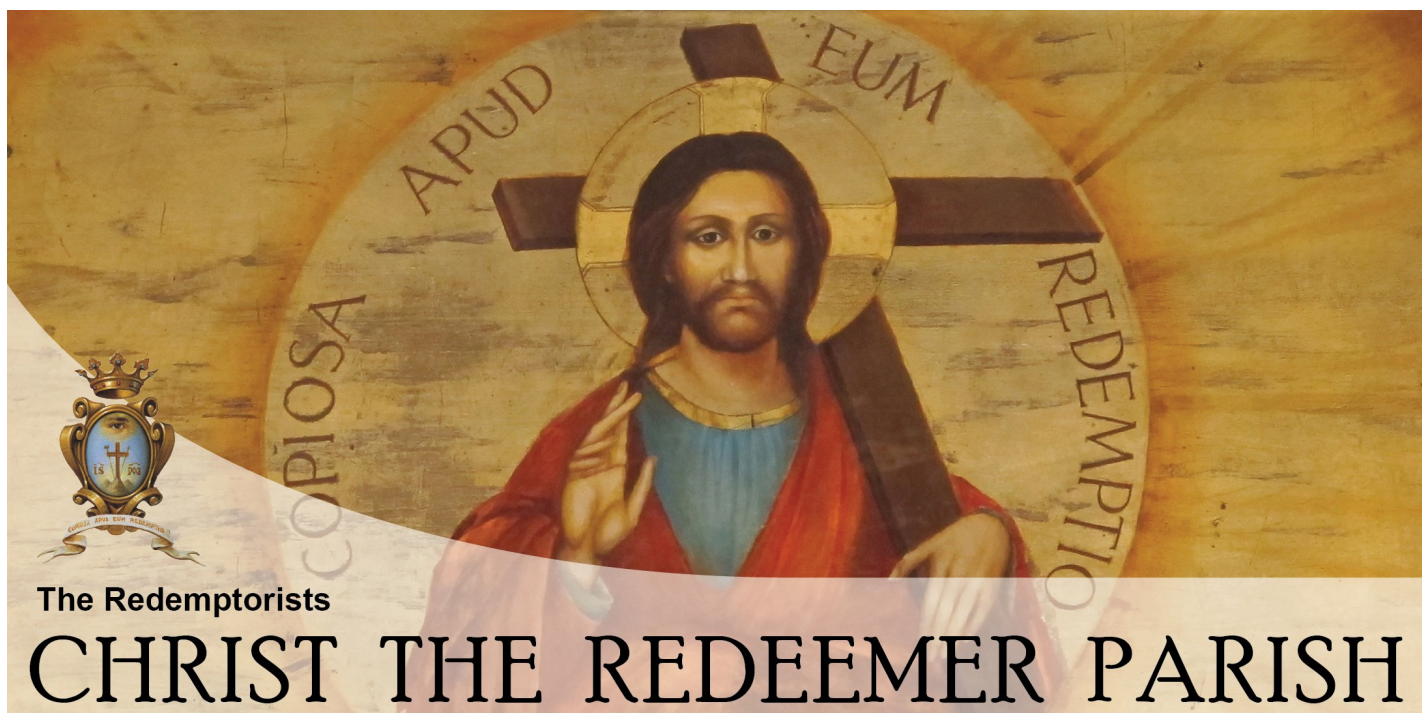

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

February 1, 2026 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 5:1-12a

A priest I know was once falsely accused of a terrible crime. The claim was wild and easily disproved, but for a while, it didn't matter. In the atmosphere shaped by the abuse crisis of the early 2000s, the public assumption was guilty until proven innocent. His name was dragged through the mud, and his ministry placed on hold. I had the privilege — and the burden — of walking closely with him during that time.

He was angry. He was confused. He felt abandoned and deeply disoriented. The last thing on his mind was the words of Jesus in today's Gospel: “Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me ... Rejoice and be glad” (Matthew 5:11-12). Rejoice? He felt anything but.

And yet... something holy slowly grew in him. Not overnight, and not without pain. But as the truth came to light and his name was cleared, I watched him become more Christlike — more patient, more compassionate, more detached from human approval.

Maybe you haven't faced something so dramatic. But where do you feel judged? Misrepresented? Overlooked? Maybe someone else got the credit or the promotion. Maybe someone you love isn't getting their due. In those moments, the Cross of Jesus is near. When we feel accused, that's when we ask him for the grace not just to endure, but somehow, mysteriously, to rejoice and be glad. — Father John Muir

MEDYTACJA EWANGELICZNA – ZACHĘTA DO GŁĘBSZEGO ROZUMIENIA PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO

Mt 5,1–12a

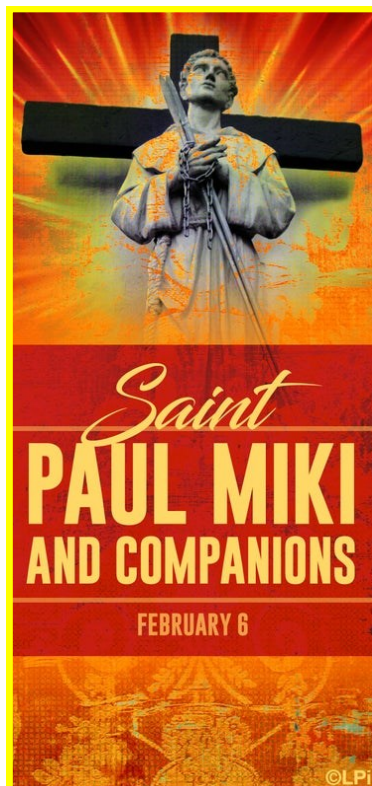
Pewien znany mi kapłan został kiedyś fałszywie oskarżony o straszny czyn. Zarzut był absurdalny i łatwy do obalenia, ale przez pewien czas nie miało to większego znaczenia. W atmosferze zdominowanej przez kryzys nadużyć w Kościele z początku lat 2000 panowało publiczne przekonanie: winnym jest każdy póki nie udowodni swojej niewinności. Jego imię zostało zszargane, a posługa zawieszona. Miałem przywilej — i jednocześnie ciężar — towarzyszyć mu w tamtym trudnym czasie.

Był zły i zagubiony. Czuł się opuszczony i głęboko zdezorientowany. Ostatnią rzeczą, o jakiej myślał, były słowa Jezusa z dzisiejszej Ewangelii: „Błogosławieni jesteście, gdy ludzie wam urągają i prześladowają was oraz gdy z mego powodu mówią kłamliwie wszystko złe na was... Cieszcie się i radujcie” (Mt 5,11–12). Radować się? Nie czułem absolutnie niczego, co przypominałoby radość.

A jednak... powoli zaczęło w nim dokonywać się coś świętego i niezwykłego. Nie dokonało się to z dnia na dzień i ale był to długi proces. Gdy prawda wyszła na jaw, a jego dobre imię zostało oczyszczone, widziałem jak stawał się coraz bardziej podobny do Chrystusa — bardziej cierpliwy, współczujący i wolny od potrzeby ludzkiego uznania.

Być może nie przyszło Ci nigdy zmierzyć się z czymś aż tak dramatycznym i trudnym. Ale gdzie ty czujesz się osądzany? Żle oceniany? Pomijany? Może ktoś inny zebrał pochwały albo otrzymał awans, tylko nie Ty. Może ktoś, kogo kochasz, nie dostaje tego, na co zasługuje. W takich momentach Krzyż Jezusa staje się rzeczywistością.

St. Blaise Blessing of the Throat

Perhaps it's an example of divine providence that the feast of St. Blaise falls on Feb. 3 — right in the middle of cold and flu season! This fourth-century Armenian saint was a bishop and martyr and is venerated as the patron of those who suffer from illnesses of the throat.

On his feast day, Catholics traditionally receive a blessing of the throat. This blessing is administered by a priest, deacon or a lay minister who follows the rites and prayers designated for a lay-person. During the blessing, the minister takes two candles that were blessed on the feast of the Presentation and makes a cross in front of the throat, saying "Through the intercession of Saint

Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from every disease of the throat and from every other illness." A priest or deacon will then make the sign of the cross.

**(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR
ORDINARY MOMENTS**

Somewhere, there is a monk whose life is very quiet and who devotes long hours to prayer. And somewhere there is a nun, cloistered in a life of contemplation, who speaks very little except to God.

Somewhere, there is a father whose days are filled with noise, who hasn't finished a Rosary in years because he keeps falling asleep. Somewhere there is a mother whose voice is weak with giving direction and offering counsel.

Somewhere, there is a teenage girl with much to say, but few people to listen — fewer, at least, than she would like. Somewhere there is a woman who holds a positive pregnancy test in one hand and a phone in the other, and somewhere there is a man on the other end of that phone who waits for her to speak.

In the Beatitudes, Jesus utilizes a literary device called anaphora. Both as a reader and a writer, I love anaphora. It's a clean, unfussy way to communicate a point. By repeating the same word or phrase at the beginning of successive clauses, you're basically saying the same thing over and over again, just a little bit differently each time. Those small differences tease at your audience's brain, gently highlighting the consistencies.

Discipleship is a lot like anaphora. It's the differences — those little aberrations from person to person, life to life — that so beautifully illustrate what remains the same across the broad spectrum of what it means to live out the Beatitudes.

Me. You. The monk. The nun. The father. The mother. The lonely girl. The man and woman who decided their own future without realizing it. How similar we all are in sin. How similar we all are in potential. How different we look to the world. And yet, how wondrous it is that we are all offered the same hope: "Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in Heaven."

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Sometimes I wonder what this world will look like when my children get to be my age. Everything seems to be changing so rapidly and much of that change doesn't seem to be for the good. I do think in some ways the Church is experiencing resurgence and a strengthening, but it will have to be in the face of an increasing culture of atheism and selfishness.

Of course, I bet my parents wondered the same thing when I was a child. As much as things change, they remain the same.

When Jesus gave his Sermon on the Mount, I would guess some parents there were having the same kind of worries. But Jesus proposed a way of life in the beatitudes that was countercultural then and is countercultural now.

In his book, *Life of Christ*, Fulton Sheen said this: "The Sermon on the Mount is so much at variance with all that our world holds dear that the world will crucify anyone who tries to live up to its values." Living a stewardship way of life means bringing the beatitudes into our daily lives in a profound way. However, it also means living in a way that others may not understand or they may even turn away from us because of it. But with the reward in the end being the kingdom of heaven, the choice is really a matter of life and death, eternally speaking.
