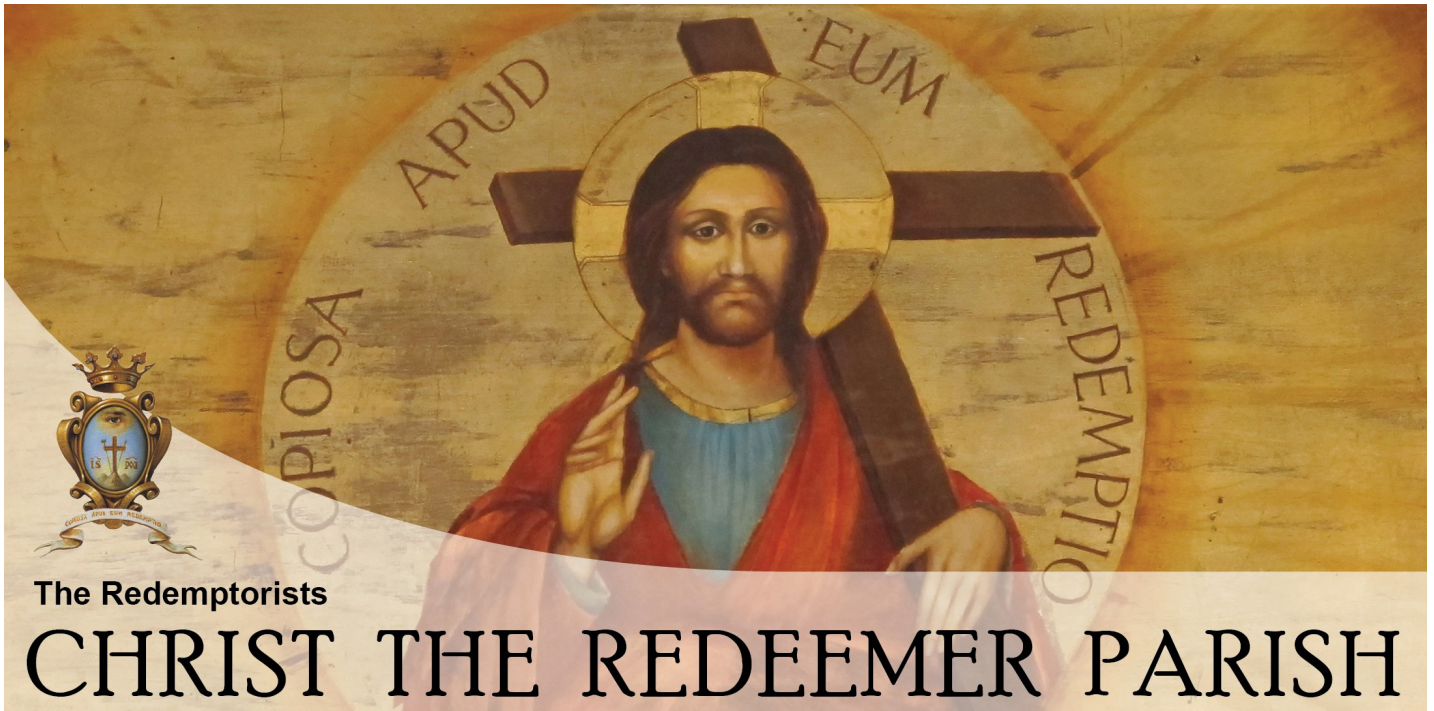

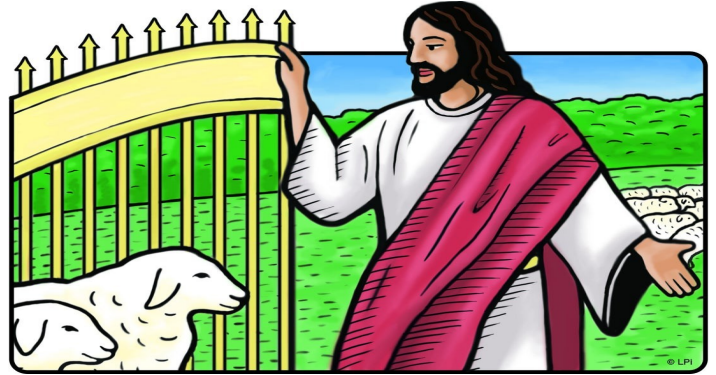

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

April 26, 2026 4th Sunday of Easter

John 10:1-10

“I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep.” John 10:11

My most boring job was working at an insurance company as a college student. My main task? Filing. Now imagine if I had told my supervisor, “I just want you to know, I’m willing to die for these files.” She would have called a psychiatrist — or at least security. There is something absurd in Jesus’ words in today’s Gospel: “I am the good shepherd... I lay down my life for the sheep.” (John 10:11) It sounds noble, until you think about it. No one dies for sheep. Not a hired hand. Not even a good shepherd. Sheep are important, sure, but not worth a human life.

And yet, Jesus insists: I will die for them. The crowd understandably responds: “He is out of his mind.”

C.S. Lewis once said that Jesus does not leave us the option of calling him merely a good teacher. If someone speaks like him, he is either lying, crazy, or telling the truth. John’s Gospel won’t let us stay sentimental. Jesus means it. He reveals a love that surpasses logic — a love that measures worth not by strength or success, but by the willingness to suffer unto death.

The Good Shepherd’s madness is mercy. His cross makes no earthly sense and yet it makes divine sense. He lays down his life not for kings or saints but for sheep — for the ordinary, the unworthy, for you and me. Think of someone who may feel unworthy of love. Do something simple and generous for them, not because they deserve it, but because Jesus did the same for you. — Father John Muir

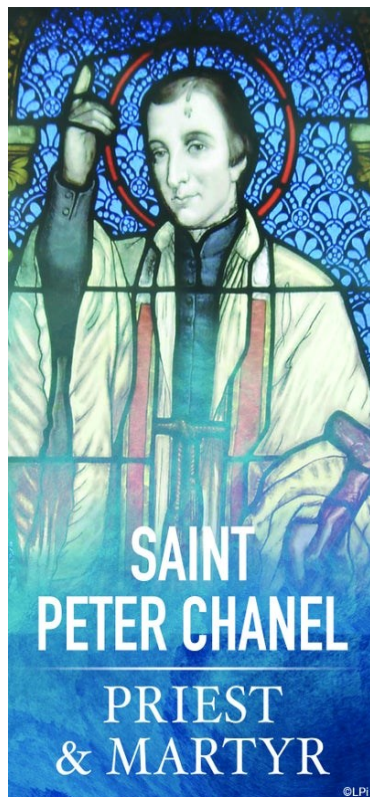

MEDYTACJA EWANGELICZNA – ZACHĘTA DO
GŁĘBSZEGO ZROZUMIENIA PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO
26 kwietnia 2026 r.
IV Niedziela Wielkanocna
J 10, 1–10

„Ja jestem dobrym pasterzem. Dobry pasterz oddaje życie za owce.” (J 10,11)

Najbardziej nużącą pracą, jaką wykonywałem jako student, była praca w firmie ubezpieczeniowej. Moje główne zadanie? Segregowanie dokumentów. Wyobraźcie sobie teraz, że mówię do przełożonej: „Chcę, żeby pani wiedziała, że jestem gotów umrzeć za te akta”. Prawdopodobnie wezwałyby psychiatrę — albo przynajmniej ochronę. W słowach Jezusa z dzisiejszej Ewangelii jest coś absurdalnego: „Ja jestem dobrym pasterzem... oddaję życie za owce” (J 10,11). Brzmi to szlachetnie — dopóki się nad tym głębiej nie zastanowimy. Nikt nie umiera za owce. Ani najemnik, ani tym bardziej pasterz. Owce są ważne, ale nie aż tak, by oddać za nie ludzkie życie.

A jednak Jezus stanowczo mówi: oddam za nie swoje życie. Nic dziwnego, że słuchacze reagują: „On odszedł od zmysłów”.

C.S. Lewis zauważył kiedyś, że Jezus nie chce byśmy uznawali Go jedynie za dobrego nauczyciela. Jeśli ktoś mówi w taki sposób jak On, to albo kłamie, albo jest szalony, albo mówi prawdę. Ewangelia św. Jana nie pozwala nam zatrzymać się na powierzchownym, sentymentalnym odbiorze. Jezus mówi serio. Objawia miłość, która przekracza logikę — miłość, która mierzy wartość nie siłą czy sukcesem, lecz gotowością do cierpienia aż po śmierć.

„Szaleństwo” Dobrego Pasterza jest miłosierdziem. Jego krzyż nie ma sensu według ludzkich kryteriów, a jednak ma sens w Bożym planie. Oddaje swoje życie nie za królów czy świętych, lecz za owce — za zwyczajnych, niegodnych, za ciebie i za mnie. Pomyśl o kimś, kto może czuć się niegodny. Zrób dla tej osoby coś prostego i hojnego — nie dlatego, że na to zasługuje, lecz dlatego, że Jezus uczynił to samo dla ciebie

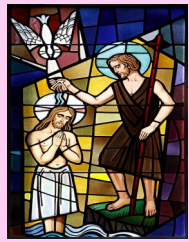

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR
ORDINARY MOMENTS

When my wireless provider introduced HD Voice, the voice I heard on my phone was unbelievably clear, and it felt at times like both the caller and I were in the same room. The best aspect of this feature is that it didn't cost the customer any additional fees, and it didn't require any changes to the phone. I could say it was free, but I suspect I was already paying for it in my monthly bill anyway. At least it felt free.

The clearer the voice calling you, the easier it is to recognize who it is on the other end of the line. In John's Gospel, Jesus speaks of the gatekeeper who opens the gate and calls for his sheep.

They respond because they know his voice. Others try to lure the sheep when the gatekeeper is not there, but the sheep find their voices unclear or unfamiliar.

Jesus is our gatekeeper. But unlike receiving something for free from a wireless company, to be able to hear his voice we need to pay attention and practice listening. By developing a stewardship way of life that is mindful and prayerful, we become attuned to his voice and are able to discern when the call is from our Lord and when it is from an imposter. It is great to talk about all the things we can do and all the gifts we can share, but if we are not listening for his call to hear where our offerings are needed, we can end up like a lost sheep searching for the gatekeeper.

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

The algorithm on my streaming service has been suggesting a lot of romantic scam documentaries lately. If you're not familiar, romantic scams are a particularly cruel form of "the long con."

Some man presents himself to some woman as Prince Charming.

He wines her. He dines her. He charms her mom and makes her friends jealous. Little red flags pop up here and there, but she shrugs them all off. She accepts convenient explanations. She just wants to be happy. And then one day, Prince Charming vanishes, along with the contents of the woman's savings account. Every victim says the same thing: "I should have known better, but I wanted it to be real." I think the reason I'm so drawn to these shows is that I identify with these women. No, I've never been the victim of a romantic scam (if my husband married me thinking he would gain access to some kind of fortune, he's the one who got scammed). But we have all told ourselves that something is right because it feels right. We have shrugged off doubts about a choice, a relationship, a habit.

We have accepted easy answers that don't pass the sniff test — because we really, really wanted an answer, and we really, really wanted it to be easy. The devil is a romantic scammer. A third-party retailer hawking knock-off joy and fulfillment. A wolf in sheep's clothing. A false prophet. A thief, a robber who has climbed the fence, knowing the gate will not admit him.

These are all different ways of saying the same thing: we can recognize what is real by where it comes from. What it sounds like. This ability to discern truth is written into our souls. We can ignore it, if we want. Suppress it. We can follow the stranger.

But where will he lead?

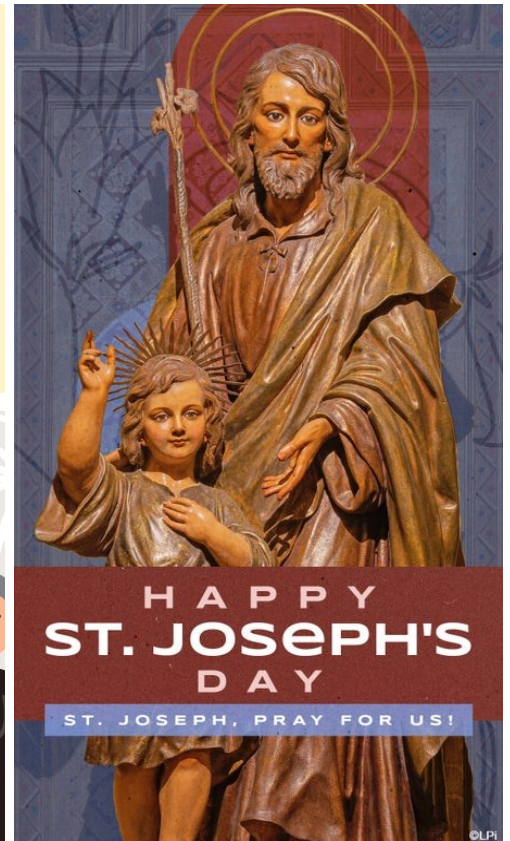

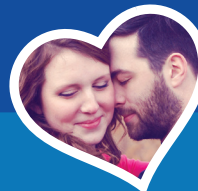
