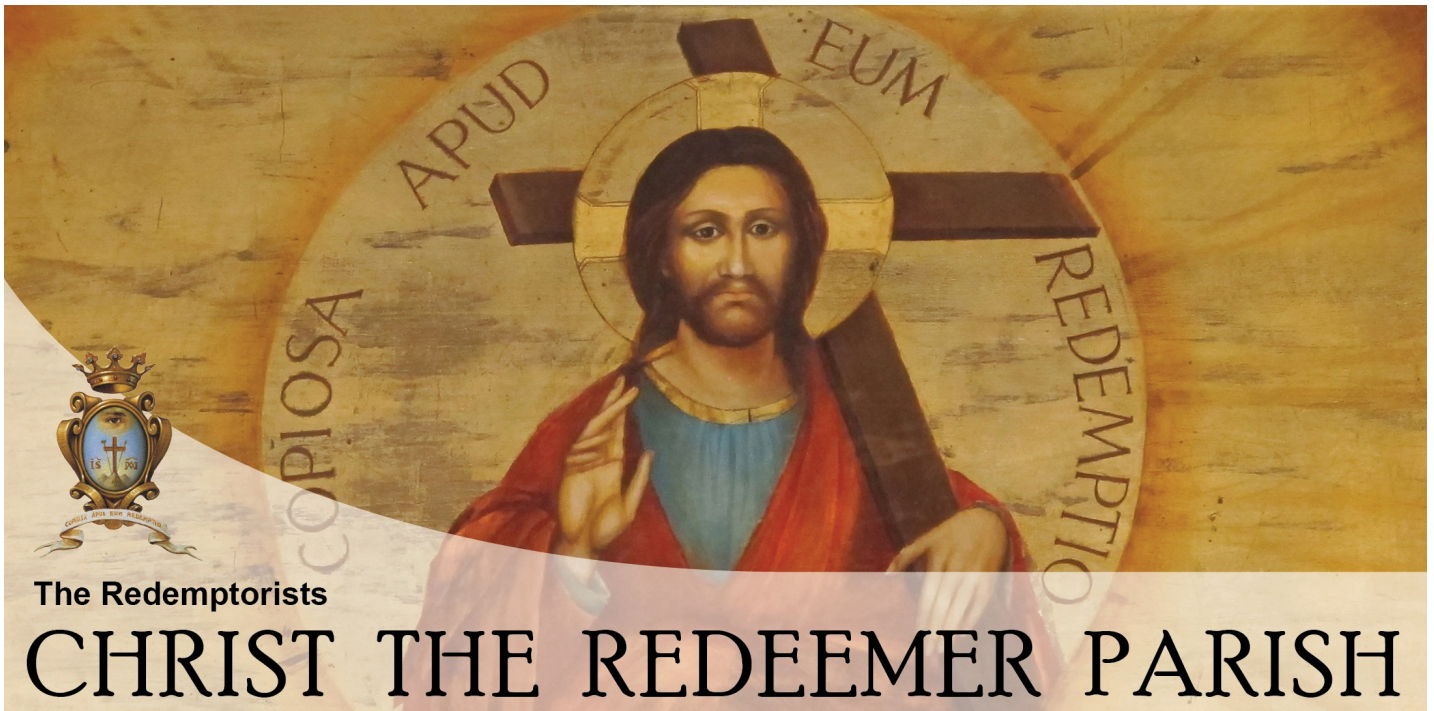

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

July 19, 2026

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew 13:24-43

A man recently told me he was losing patience with the Church. "It's supposed to be God's Kingdom on earth," he said, "but it's full of contradictions and hypocrisy. Why can't the Church just be better?" That last word landed with a judgmental thud. It hurt. Because at times the Church can look painfully ordinary, even disappointing.

But Jesus' parables in today's Gospel meet that frustration head-on. He says, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a man who sowed good seed in his field," yet the weeds grow up with the wheat, and the master allows both to grow together until harvest. To his listeners, this sounded strange, even offensive. They expected God's reign to be pure, powerful, and glorious, anything but mixed up, hidden, or small.

Jesus is showing us something essential. The Kingdom always begins small and grows amid imperfection. Grace and weakness exist side by side until the harvest. That is why the Church often looks messy. Yet within that mess, God's quiet work continues. The weeds do not stop the wheat from growing. When we see the Church's flaws or our own, it helps to remember that this is exactly the field in which Christ chose to plant. The miracle is not that everything looks perfect, but that his Word keeps taking root anyway.

Lord, give me patience with Your field, the Church. Help me see Your hidden life growing even among the weeds. Amen.

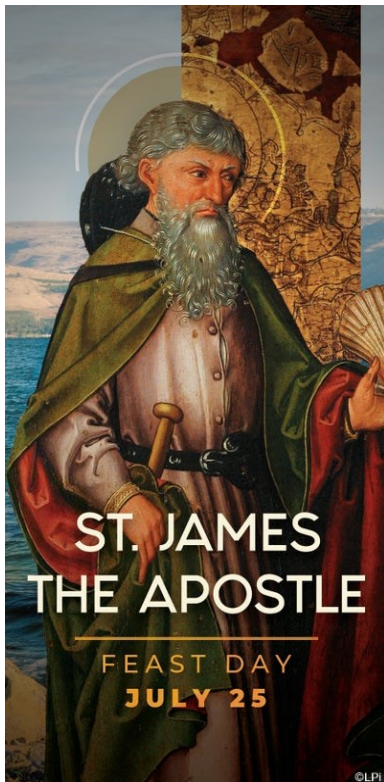

MEDYTACJA DO EWANGELII – ZACHĘTA DO
GŁĘBSZEGO ZROZUMIENIA PISMA ŚWIĘTEGO

19 lipca 2026 r.
XVI Niedziela Zwykła
Ewangelia: Mt 13, 24–43

Pewien mężczyzna powiedział mi niedawno, że traci cierpliwość do Kościoła.

– „Przecież to ma być Królestwo Boże na ziemi, a jest pełne sprzeczności i hipokryzji. Dlaczego Kościół nie może być po prostu lepszy?” To ostatnie słowo – „lepszy” – zabrzmiało jak surowy osąd. Zabolalo. Bo rzeczywiście, czasami Kościół wydaje się boleśnie zwyczajny, a nawet rozczarowujący.

Jednak przypowieść Jezusa z dzisiejszej Ewangelii odpowiada ją właśnie na tę frustrację. Jezus mówi: „Królestwo Niebieskie podobne jest do człowieka, który posiał dobre nasienie na swojej roli”. Mimo to pośród pszenicy wyrasta chwast, a gospodarz pozwala jednemu i drugiemu rosnąć aż do czasu żniwa.

Dla słuchaczy Jezusa było to coś dziwnego, a nawet gorszącego. Oczekiwali, że panowanie Boga będzie doskonałe, potężne i pełne chwały – a nie słabe, ukryte czy niepozorne.

Jezus ukazuje nam coś bardzo ważnego. Królestwo Boże zawsze zaczyna się od małych rzeczy i wzrasta pośród ludzkiej niedoskonałości. Łaska i słabość istnieją obok siebie aż do czasu ostatecznych żniw. Dlatego Kościół często wydaje się chaotyczny i pełen niedoskonałości. A jednak właśnie pośród tego całego zamieszania Bóg nieustannie działa. Chwasty nie są w stanie powstrzymać wzrostu pszenicy. Kiedy dostrzegamy słabości Kościoła lub własne grzechy, warto pamiętać, że to właśnie na takim polu Chrystus postanowił zasiać swoje ziarno. Cudem nie jest to, że wszystko wygląda idealnie, ale to, że Jego słowo mimo wszystko nieustannie zapuszcza korzenie i przynosi owoce.

Panie, daj mi cierpliwość wobec Twojego pola, którym jest Kościół. Pomóż mi dostrzegać Twoje ukryte działanie nawet pośród chwastów. Amen. — o. John Muir

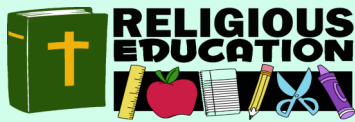

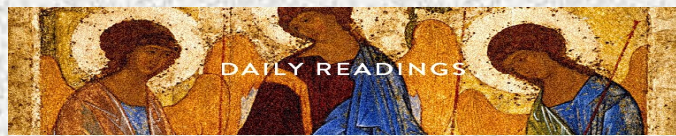

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

A friend recently confided in me that although he prayed frequently each day and was involved heavily in his parish, he did not sense much fruit coming from it all and was left feeling unsatisfied. I assured him he was not alone. I told him of a deceased pastor of mine who had spoken frequently about being in this type of situation. Even as a priest, he knew all too well of how we can feel like we are simply going through the motions. It is precisely at those times that continuing to pray and practicing good stewardship is most important, because it would be easier to simply take a break and risk never coming back. He liked to say, "Do the drill," meaning just do what needs to be done. We are all called to be mature disciples who answer the call of Jesus Christ regardless of the cost. We cannot choose when and where the call will come. We cannot schedule our stewardship in a way that is always most convenient for us. Even when the fruits of our faithful efforts seem hidden from us, we hold to the promise that we are never called to give of ourselves for nothing. God is working through us and in us. No matter how dry the land may seem, seeds are being planted to yield a harvest greater than we can ever realize. Stay strong and do the drill! — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS

(PRACTICING) CATHOLIC - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Driving up my street in late spring, you can see which yard is mine from a whole block away: it's the one covered in dandelions. And I like it that way. I fear neither my husband's shame nor the snarky comments of neighbors: I will never apologize for my dandelion-filled yard. "It's for the pollinators," I say, but it's a total lie. I just think it looks lovely. Who doesn't like a splash of yellow after a long, dreary winter? People call dandelions "weeds," but it's just not true. Weeds are, by definition, any plant growing where it isn't wanted. A rosebush is a weed, if it's in the middle of a cornfield. I want my dandelions. Plants that are commonly considered weeds can even have beneficial properties. They attract pollinators, for instance, and they promote nutrient cycling, whereby soil health is improved. We all have metaphorical "weeds" in the garden of our lives. I certainly do: facets of my personality I loathe, realities of my life I resent, limitations in my abilities I dread—these are my weeds, and their roots run deep, coiling closely around those of the plants I try to cultivate. But if I could rid my garden of any one of these weeds, would it really benefit me? And if I examined them all closely, could I tell them apart—the blessing from the curse, the struggle from the triumph? One day, it will all become clear: what is the wheat, and what is the weed. We will be put to our ultimate purpose, and we will see ourselves for what we are meant to be. Until then, we need the weeds. It's not harvest time yet.

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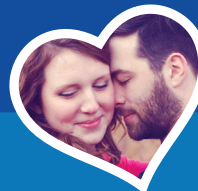
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
